A worker cooperative is a for-profit business that is owned and managed by the people that work there. Workers come together to meet common financial, social and cultural needs for themselves, their community and future generations.

There are not enough economic opportunities for people in South Los Angeles, especially for people when they come home from prison or jail. The lack of housing, job opportunities, and services make re-entry extremely difficult.

Worker cooperatives are a real option for people who historically experience life-long

discrimination in the workforce as the workers are their own boss and they decide the hiring criteria.

Seminars are organized by Collective REMAKE with support from LA Coop LAB, Los Angeles Union Cooperative Initiative (LUCI) & Solidarity Research Center.

Collective REMAKE supports the creation of worker-owned businesses and other kinds of cooperatives with people who have been incarcerated and others who are marginalized due to race, class, sex, gender identity, age or ability.
